T'Gallant is the sailor's abbreviation of topgallant, the top sail of square-rigger sailing ships. It connotes the peak, the best, the epitome. The Cape Schanck Rosé is a truly seductive wine - the result of a near-perfect vintage. It is a beautiful, blushing creation from Heathcote, Victoria, with all components contributing to the beguiling red fruit aromas, savoury tannins and firm yet elegant structure of this wine. Pair with antipasti platters, cured meats and oily fish, including salmon and trout.

### Vintage conditions:

The region saw slightly warmer night time temperatures in December and early January, which contributed to early ripening throughout the region.

### Technical Analysis

**Colour** Pale salmon with rose-coloured hues

**Nose** Fresh aromas of strawberry, watermelon and sweet spice

**Palate** Vibrant and fresh, the palate shows watermelon and cranberry fruits with crunchy acidity and a dry, savoury finish. A refreshing style, reminiscent of a French Provencal style of rosé.
