Handmade and crafted, T'Gallant wines exude a vibrant and eccentric personality, using a twist of traditional European winemaking techniques and styles on these truly Victorian wines. Established in 1990, T'Gallant founders Kevin McCarthy and Kathleen Quealy were instrumental in introducing Pinot Gris to Australia. Considered a bold move at the time, the wines nonetheless flourished and T'Gallant became Australia's leader in this cool climate grape variety.

Vintage conditions:

A cool, dry winter was followed by warm and windy spring conditions with normal rainfall. Summer temperatures were average, with persistent fine conditions and little rain. Fruit was able to be harvested a little ahead of average - retaining acidity in the fruit while maintaining flavour
